Correspondence:

University of Washington Laboratories sent the Town of Friday Harbor a letter offering us a 1961 Chevrolet Panel Truck, motor No. AJCA863065. Mayor Browne instructed Attorney Schmidt to have this truck officially transferred to Town.

Letter from Washington State Fireman's Association re 1968 dues.

Letter from Board of Volunteer Firemen re Relief & Pension Fund. Mayor Browne stated he would take these up with the Fire Chief, but he did not believe that Town handled either of these.

Letter from State Treasurer with form to fill out re Affidavit of Eligibility & Budget Summary - Firemen & Police. This not applicable to Friday Harbor.

Letter from State Highway Commission requesting two maps of Friday Harbor to assist them in conducting a vehicle miles traffic count study. Mr. Ertter to supply the maps from those put out by San Juan Properties.

Letter from John R. Molsness, District Sanitary Engineer of State of Washington, which included his report of his recent visit to our Filter Plant.

Letter from San Juan Island Garden Club requesting assistance in their Beautification Program.

Old Business:

Resolution #253. Catalog studied as to suitable plaque for former Town Clerk. Attorney Schmidt to order and have engraving placed thereon.

Attorney Schmidt collected \$38.00 from Allen Mason in payment of damage to Street & Stop sign at Marguerite and Guard Streets.

Mr. Bert Lawson appeared to request that City put on surcharge for users who are attached to his waterline at Hillside Terrace. After discussion it was decided that it would be best for all if buyers of his property form their own Water Association to pay for needed pump and upkeep.

Orcas Power & Light Company contract for new street lighting was studied. Attorney Schmidt suggested that one sentence therein is deleted. It was decided that the Council meeting be adjourned until Monday noon when a meeting could be set up with OPALCO and Mr. Scharnhorst.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

The adjourned meeting was called to order by Mayor Browne at 2:00 p.m., January 22, 1968 at the offices of OPALCO in the Town of Friday Harbor.

Those present were: Mayor, James Browne, Sr., Councilmen William Erickson, Ross Ertter, Lawrence Getz, Joe Gutierrez and Warren Jones, and Attorney Charles Schmidt.

The matter of the street lighting contract with OPALCO was again taken up and specifically there was discussion on Paragraph 5, the last sentence thereof. Discussion was had reflecting that the language was picked up front the existing contract, which was drawn up in 1959. It was not in the 1951 contract. The city attorney noted the possible objections of that language. It was pointed out by Opalco that the matter of entering into a new contract updating the street lighting in the Town of Friday Harbor was instituted by the Town Council, a request being made some two years ago by Mr. Art Froland then a member of the Council, following further discussion, a motion was made by Warren Jones that the Town of Friday Harbor accept the contract as prepared and submitted. William Erickson seconded this motion. Ross Ertter made a motion to table and shortly thereafter Mr. Ertter withdrew his motion. A vote was taken and those in favor of accepting the contract voting were four (4) in number, Lawrence Getz, William Erickson, Joe Gutierrez and Warren Jones. Voting "no" was Ross Ertter.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 2:50 p.m.

FRIDAY HARBOR, WASHII4GTON
February 1, 1968

Council met in regular session with Mayor J. E. Browne, Sr. in the chair.

Councilmen present were: W. Erickson, R. Ertter, L. Getz, J. Gutierrez & W. Jones.

Others present: Treasurer C.C. Vandersluys & Gordon Johnson.

Minutes of previous meeting approved as read except that the words "had to" were deleted from the third to last line of the last paragraph and the word withdraw changed to withdrew.

Old Business

Insurance - Joe Gutierrez met with a representative of Safeco, but still hasn't been able to obtain any Lid on "blanket" policy. Will continue working toward this end.

New Business

Robert Sandwith appeared regarding the water overcharge. He left with the knowledge that the charge of 80 cents per thousand-gallon overage for out-of-town users is set until something different can be worked out.

Gordon Johnson advised that big trees are interlocking and hanging over the water trestle. It would cost approximately \$2,000.00 to hire someone to clear them. Members of Council decided to inspect them before deciding to cut down the trees. Mr. Ertter offered to obtain a bid on chain saws with the possibility of our men doing the job themselves.

Mayor Browne set the wages for labor to start at \$2.65 an hour, raising them to \$2.75 an hour after six months.

After discussion with Treasurer it was moved by Warren Jones, Seconded by Joe Gutierrez and unanimously passed that we transfer \$3,600 from Current account and \$3,600.00 from Street account to Water account. Also charge Current Account (Sewer)\$1,000.00 for rental of Backhoe which is owned by Water Dept. and used by Street C. and sewer in 1967.

Correspondence

Letter from George Jeffers stating Puget Sound Herring Co. has leased his red web house for a few months for a small herring freezing operation and needs water. After considerable discussion the Water Commissioner was requested to remove the large water filter at Friday Harbor Canning Co. and contact Mr. Jeffers to see what could be worked out regarding water on a smaller scale.

Letter received from Army Engineers re new proposed Ferry Dock. Mayor asked that Attorney Schmidt reply to their letter in order to determine what, if any, interference or damage to the sewer line would be caused by the installation of the Ferry Slip in the proposed location.

Letter from Foster & Marshalls re annual report of Fire & date departments. Reports to be filled out and approved by Council before returning to them.

Gordon Johnson asked what could be done regarding Dale Rishel Sr. request for sewer hookup. He was requested to get more information as to path pipe would take before a decision could be made.

With so many questions coming up regarding new water lines and cost of water, the Mayor called a special meeting for Thursday, February 8th for discussion of water problems only.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.

From Association of Washington Cities regarding survey of Liability Insurance. Clerk instructed to fill out report stating that we do not have Liability Insurance but that it is under study.

Forms received front Standard Oil Co. to be signed exempting the Town front taxes until 3/31/69.

The Washington State Highway Commission replied to Attorney Schmidt's letter of February 7, 1968 regarding the new terry Terminal, enclosing a layout and explaining that bids open on March 13, 1968 and the approximate completion date for Terminal if September 1963.

Old Business

Homelight chain saw was purchased from Mr. Murphy and Mr. Johnson and Mr. Crosby are busy clearing the road to the lake. Mr. Vandersluys reported that he had gone to the lake with Mr. Johnson and stated that the ditches were filled with brush causing water to wash the road away. The trees hanging over the trestle definitely need cutting.

Mr. Gutierrez prepared the information on water rates as discussed at the special Council meeting February 8th. Each member took a copy home to study. Another special meeting to be set up to complete the study.

Attorney Schmidt reported he has heard from Ark Chin regarding proposed sewer grant. The Federal government have set aside \$86,000.00 and State will match 1/2 or \$43,000.00. Carey & Kramer suggested that we delay acceptance until they can complete their study. They hope to be here March 7th. Two men from Farmers Homeowners Administration were in town on Wednesday and met with Mayor Browne. They seemed certain they would be able to help up to \$200,000.00.

Street classification map received from Allinson, Inc., but work sheets by Arvid Grant explaining map not included.

New Business

Mrs. B. Schuman and several boys and girls of 4-H Club attended the meeting to observe how Council works. She said 4-H Club was holding their annual "Clean Up" campaign in title County April 20th and asked the town to hold one at the same time. Mayor Browne promised to see if such could be arranged.

Mr. Peter Hansen came to meeting with regard to an apparent misunderstanding regarding a portion of property adjoining his which he had been using when having his wood hauled to his house. Attorney Schmidt assured him he had no need to worry.

The 4-H Club agreed to paint the Litter barrels and Mr. Vandersluys offered to steam clean them first.

Mr. Getz reported that the water tank at house has gone.

Mr. Ertter reminded Council of the need of a sidewalk from Presbyterian Church to Nursing Home. Mayor said he would check with Jim Cahail to see how this project had progressed.

City Attorney Schmidt presented Resolution 258 "A Resolution of the Town of Friday Harbor providing for regulations governing Subdivisions, Plats, re-Plats and other dedications within the Town of Friday harbor." No action taken.

Dr. Heath spoke regarding two spots on our highways that are dangerous. One is the rise of the hill by Joe Dunn's where road goes off into sub-division. The other is the corner at Spring, Marguerite Place & Valley View road. If the new proposed Cement Plant goes in across from the Airport, the water tank corner will be more dangerous than it is now with Nielsen's hedge across the street.

Mayor Browne stated he would see Mr. Nielsen and endeavor to get the hedge cut back for more safety.

Water Forman, Gordon Johnson, stated that someone had been on top of water tank and removed the lid. He sent a sample of water to Dr. Heath who could not find any impurities. However, another sample was sent away for further tests. Mayor Browne and the Council instructed Mr. Johnson to remove the ladder from the tank to try and avoid future damage to Town water supply.

Councilman Dubois also asked if anything could be done concerning the Garage at the corner of Spring & Argyle. He felt it was a traffic hazard with the gas pumps at the edge of the street. Also the parking of garage cars on Springs Street was taking parking space from shoppers. Mayor said he would ask Attorney C.C. Schmidt to write Mr. Capron a letter explaining the above and asking him to bear in mind, if he should sell the garage, just the pumps would have to be moved from the street.

Councilman Dubois suggested that Clerk put an article in the Friday Harbor Journal after each meeting in order that the Townspeople will know what the Council is doing. Upon his offer to assist the Clerk it was agreed that this should be done.

Mayor advised Clerk to pay \$2.75 an hour to Joe Zylstra for labor.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned to Friday, December 20, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. for the receiving and/or hearing bids for the improvements to East Street.

At a special meeting Friday, December 20, 1968 bids for the improvements to East Street were read and it was moved by W. Jones, seconded by H. Dubois and carried that bid presented by Island Construction Company be accepted.
